Flood Relief Columbia, South Carolina

In April a group of 8 of us gathered from several different states to meet in Columbia, South Carolina, to assist in rebuilding efforts after the devastating flooding that city experienced last year. We spent the week working on two neighboring houses that sustained substantial water damage in the initial flooding and were undergoing renovation. We worked on sheetrock, painting, trim, electrical and installing doors. The homeowners were so appreciative of the work we did but I think we were more blessed meeting them, working in their homes and hearing their stories. Our accommodations for the week were at Riverside Community Church. It also sustained significant flood damage and they had just completed renovating prior to our trip. During the week different home groups in the church provided us with meals and shared their vision for continuing to partner long term with Crisis Response to continue relief efforts in Columbia. Our time in Columbia may have been short, but through work teams like ours the church is able to establish relationships in the community. It was a privilege to be a part of that work.

The blessings we receive by serving others far exceed the blessings others receive from our services. This saying once again proved to be true as 8 of us found ourselves in Columbia, South Carolina to help 2 families whose homes were devastated by a 1,000 year flood that occurred in October 2015.

We accomplished our goal of refurbishing these homes, and also enjoyed fellowship and fun with each other, the staff of Riverside Community Church (an Evangelical Free Church), and enjoyed getting to know the families in whose homes we worked. Each day before we began our job, we prayed with each family. We, along with these families, were greatly encouraged by the time spent together and in seeing all the improvements to their living conditions.
