Between our team and a AllianzMission team from Germany three of the old cabins were replaced in 2016, so this year's project will make a total 5 new cabins. The estimate for the new cabin, bunk beds, and comfort room is: Cabin \$3660, Bunks \$870, and Comfort room (Restroom/showers) \$2000 for a total of \$6530, of which we have received \$2800. We would like to ask you to help us raise the remaining \$3730 so that we can complete this project for full usability for the upcoming camping season.


Please pray that our team would be an encouragement to our brothers and sisters in Christ in the Philippines, and that we would be used as His light to the community:

What made such an impression on us was how connected the universal church is, despite language barriers and cultural differences, and how vital it is to spend time encouraging one another in our




recipients of such trust, kindness and gratitude.
