The church we have been working with in Poland is situated in the heart of Poland, and their vision is to use the facility as a conference center. They are currently using part of the facility like this, but there is much to complete to make it fully functional. The church is moving ahead with the project. I am often asked if the church works on things while we are gone? The answer is most certainly, "Yes!" Due to the skill

sets in the church, much of this work is completed by contractors. In the last several years they have completed the exterior finish, installed entry way doors, tiled the exterior steps, and installed the new electrical service. More recently, they have completed all of the rough plumbing, including floor heat. They have the rough wiring done for the ground floor and are in the process of completing two showers in the basement and the bathroom we

framed in the fall of 2017, and they have started pouring the concrete floors. Like many churches, the finances for the projects are the toughest part of the project. There are several parts of the project that need to be completed by contactors before we can send another team. If you would like to help move this project forward, you can send funds through MCT to them.



Camp Bato, Sibonga, Cebu Island, Philippines

The camp Bato project is moving forward. They are currently replacing the Chapel and Dining Hall, a two story structure, and building it out of concrete and steel. The last update on this project is that they have poured the second floor for the new Chapel. Their vision is to make Camp Bato a facility that can be used for camps and conferences year around. To bring this project to completion, they need to replace the two story staff house, drill a well that produces year around, complete the chapel building, add more cabins for a total of 12 (presently 8) and complete their sanitary sewer.



MCT has agreed to send a team for February 2019 to help replace the two story staff house. We will be recruiting a team of eight - in addition a couple from the Philip-

pines will be joining us on the team.

Last Two Cabins Finished And All Eight Cabins Completed

We praise the Lord for the construction of the last two cabins at Camp Bato by the Missionary Construction Team last Feb. 10 to March 2, 2018. This has completed the renovation of all eight old cabins - with bunk beds also with a total of 138 beds for eight cabins.

The MCT was instrumental in the construction of five of the eight cabins, including the making of several bunk beds. The new cabins have showers, comfort rooms, and sinks in-between.



<u>Cabin Names & The Twelve Foundation Stones</u> of the New Jerusalem

Our campsite is called "Camp Bato" (Bato means Stone) because of a huge mountain of stone over the camp premises. And our camp cabins are named after the twelve foundation stones of the new Jerusalem in Revelation 21, which were also the gemstones of the high priests' breastplate in Exodus 18. The cabins' names will remind us of the beauty and wonder of God's redemptive plan through our Lord Jesus Christ. Below is one of the cabin names.



<u>Immediate Needs And Prayer Concerns</u>

Kindly pray with us as we continue to trust the Lord for more financial provisions for the other needs at Camp Bato, as follows:

1. Four more cabins

Having eight cabins at present, we trust the Lord to provide us with four more cabins in order to complete



the names of the twelve foundation stones of the New Jerusalem, and also to increase the camp's capacity for use. Our plan is to rebuild the old staff house with cabins to be attached to it, and to convert also the old comfort rooms to become cabins.

2. Completion of new Chapel and Dining Hall

The old chapel and dining hall was demolished as it was no longer safe for use. We praise the Lord for the seed money donated to begin the initial construction of the new one. We pray for more provision to finish

the whole project.

3.<u>Bigger water supply</u>

The present water supply was put up more than thirty years ago, and it needs to be upgraded due to bigger consumption. We need to drill a deeper well with a bigger casing, using a bigger power submersible pump, plus a bigger water tank. The initial estimate is quite a considerable amount.
