

# Cebu Island, Philippines

We are heading back to Camp Bato, February 6 - 25, 2019. We have a team of six as of this newsletter printing. Last year as we worked on the last two cabins, we were watching a contractor building the new chapel



and dining hall. At that time they were setting shoring for the second floor. While we were there they finished forming the beams and tying the rebar for those beams. After we left they finished the deck forming and rebar, then brought in the pump trucks to pour the chapel deck. Since that time they fin-



ished the super structure to hold the roof, and it is now roofed. They set up temporary hand rails so they were

able to use the camp this last summer. They were able **New Chapel** and Dining Hall with temporary


handrails

to use the camp for many folks to hear the word and follow Christ. There has been a lot of training and discipleship taking place at this camp since we were there last February. Our project this February is to help the camp install permanent handrails, the stage, comfort rooms, and

steel louvers. Our plan is for the team to bring about \$10,500 for materials to bring the chapel up to safe permanent use, but we cannot do this on our own; we need your help. We have been in a partnership with the Evangelical Free Church of the Philippines on this project
